Local Attractions

Llanarmon-yn-Ial is situated in a designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty with a wide range of activities available to meet all needs.

Llanarmon-yn-Ial is itself an ideal centre for walking holidays, whether it is to explore the Clywdian range and the Offa's Dyke path or the Limestone pavements on the other side of the valley

Nearby we have Gweryd Lakes offering fishing, nature trails, a base for riding and providing bed and breakfast accommodation and a camp-site.

If you are into Mountain Biking, there are again many trails you can take from the village or, if looking for something a little more exciting, we are very close to Coed Llandegla Forest, with its excellent Mountain Bike Centre and café.

Within the village we also have Pen-Y-Ffrith Bird Gardens. These are 18 acres of Woodland Gardens with streams, pools and waterfalls and a 3 acre lake. Plenty to see for old and young alike.

Also, readily accessible from Llanarmon-yn-Ial, we have Ruthin with its excellent Craft Centre and 'must see' Ruthin Gaol. Moel Fammau and Loggerheads Country Park are 10 minutes away by car and Snowdonia National Park 35 mins by car. For the more cultured there is also the renowned Clwyd Theatr Cymru in Mold.

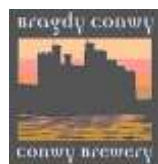

Welcome to The Raven Inn, a traditional community orientated free house situated in the heart of the picturesque North Wales village of Llanarmon-yn-Ial, Denbighshire.

Llanarmon-yn-Ial is situated under the Clwydian hills in a designated AONB. It is one of the few villages remaining which still retains a church, a chapel, shop, post office, school and pub.

The Raven Inn has been run by the community since August 2009. A traditional country pub, we offer mouth watering, locally sourced food and the best real ales North Wales has to offer. We regularly bring in the best of local musical talent befitting a traditional country inn.

A not for profit company limited by guarantee has been set up to run the pub, Raven Mad Ltd. The Raven Inn is manned by volunteers and any surplus profit will be used to fund village community projects.
